#### FROM THE ELDERS A Commitment to Communicate

When the people on B Street, who were now crying even louder, noticed that A Street was completely empty -

The lesson of this fictional story shows what can happen when assumptions are made and individuals suffer from a lack of meaningful communication. It also has applicability to our church. As leaders, in order to promote involvement and commitment to ministry during our time of pastoral vacancy, we know we need to communicate more often. Only then can we


> limit misunderstanding when our members are kept fully informed.

That is the purpose of this written communication, titled "A Joyful Word." it is designed at this time in our church life to keep us focused on the words of John 16:24, "Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full." Keeping members informed promotes transparency and builds trust which is crucial in maintaining

a healthy and thriving church community.

It is our intent to distribute "A Joyful Word" once a month during the time of our vacancy. In addition to the weekly bulletin, and our quarterly issues of the Western Times, it is our hope that a strong connection to worship and ministries can








be maintained and even enhanced as together we grow in Christian fellowship.

#### A Joyful Word - Worship

The Elders are to supervise the worship services that will be held for our congregation in our time of vacancy. Our worship philosophy is to be: God-Honoring, Biblical, Dialogical, Holistic, Unifying, Authentic, Multi-generational, and Beautiful.

To ensure there is continuity in our morning services, Pastor Ben Snoek will preach the first Sunday of every month in a service that will include communion. The 4th Sunday and months with a 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday, Rev. Ted Boswell will lead us in worship. The pulpit on the remaining Sundays will be filled by guest pastors.



Pastor Ben, as Worship Advisor, will be supporting our church weekly in planning the liturgical elements of all services while serving along with Renee DeJager for Music Ministry in monthly meetings of the Worship Committee.

### A Joyful Word - Pastor Search

The process of seeking a pastor in the CRC is quite different today than what it was like 16 years ago before we were blessed with the calling of Pastor Mark. With numerous vacancies across the denomination, fewer candidates completing their study at seminary with a desire to be a lead pastor, and the challenging societal issues facing churches today, the traditional method of seeking a pastor by scouring the Yearbook no longer is the most effective use of time and resources.

The committee recommended that the Rukes Group, a

pastoral search firm, should be engaged to source, interview, and vet candidates for our search committee to consider.

The Administration Committee at its August meeting approved utilizing the services of the Rukes Group and are encouraged that Rev. Sam Hamstra has been assigned to a s s i s t o u r s e a r c h committee. He will also aid in the process of determining from sessions with our congregation

with our congregation where we are at today and what we should be as part of God's Kingdom in the future. This visioning work is necessary in order for our Council to complete the denominational church profile.

A request has been made to the Northern Illinois Classis to appoint Rev. John Huizinga, Pastor at Lombard CRC to be our Classis Counselor. He will ensure that appropriate Church Order protocols are followed.



Effective communication is evident when the intended message is successfully delivered, received and understood. Each member of our congregation can be assured that your Council, with God's help, will do all we can to ensure that we continue to be a blessing to all our fellow believers. God intends for us to join in a journey of faith, hope, and love.

This is a journey that calls for prayer, and for a posture that remembers our efforts fit within the larger framework of our God whose work on our behalf has already begun.
