A Joyful Word – Commitment to Communicate

It's even more awesome to reflect on the constant presence of God Himself. James writes, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not

change like shifting shadows" (James 1:17). The apostle puts this in the context of our own struggles: "When troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy" (v. 2).

Why does this matter for us personally and as a church? Because we're blessed to be loved by a great and unchanging God! God's love is constant, consistent, and steadfast. Despite our continual flaws, sin, and tendency to become distant from God, God's love draws us closer back to Him.


In a world where giving and receiving love is often conditional and fleeting, God's love is stable, comforting, supportive and a source of refuge. While we may not always "feel" God's love, the Bible reminds and reaffirms to us that God's love is unfailing, unmovable, and unconditional.

In times of trouble, we need to remember God's constant provision. Perhaps we might recall the

words of the great hymn <u>Great Is Thy Faithfulness</u>. "There is no shadow of turning with thee; / thou changest not, thy compassions, they fail not; / as thou hast been thou forever wilt be."

Yes, our God has left His permanent footprint on our world. He will always be there for us. Great is His faithfulness.





Pastor Ben's thoughts for ministry at our church in the upcoming year:
